

President's Message

Hello Downtown Neighbors,

Last month we discussed some key matters at City Hall, and the work isn't slowing down. With a full summer agenda of items lined up for the city commission, the Downtown Sarasota Condo Association (DSCA) is actively monitoring issues that matter to you, such as attainable housing. The first

portion of the zoning text amendments related to downtown zones has been approved in its first reading by the city commission. These amendments are being refined and will be brought back for additional consideration by the city commission in September. DSCA will be carefully reviewing the final draft.

Earlier this week, the city established a seven-member Purple Ribbon Committee to develop recommendations for the future of the Van Wezel Performing Arts Center. You can find a summary and a link to the video of the first committee meeting below. Alongside the work of the Purple Ribbon Committee, the Sarasota Performing Arts Foundation is leading discussions with the architectural firm chosen to design a potential new performing arts center. These conversations are progressing, and we anticipate more information soon.

The city's FY24 and Capital Improvement Budget was a significant topic of discussion in late July. City Manager Brown presented a draft budget, which was discussed in workshop format over two days. The budget considerations will continue during early September, addressing population growth, rising costs, and important infrastructure needs. Regarding finances, expect your property tax assessments in the mail any day now – you'll see they've probably risen by about 13%.

One final but important thought: a special shoutout to DSCA's Associate Members, our local businesses known for their professional services. Through their participation at our meetings and support for our workshops, they offer invaluable advice and insights that enhance our community's progress. Their contributions are truly appreciated. Please check out the full list of members at the DSCA website and consider supporting their businesses.

Stay engaged and reach out with any thoughts or questions. More updates will follow. Our focus remains on representing the interests of downtown residents and working towards the best outcomes for our community.

Attainable Housing

The City of Sarasota's Planning Department is three open houses to discuss new mixed-use zoning districts and receive public input.

The first open house is **5:30-7 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 24** at the Selby Public Library, 1331 First Street.

A potential Zoning Text Amendment would create new mixed-use zone districts to incentivize on-site attainable housing along commercial corridors and in commercial centers.

The open houses will begin with a staff presentation, followed by break-out sessions to foster conversation on the following topics:

- Future Land Use and Zoning
- Mixed-Use Zone Districts
- Attainable Housing
- Design Standards
- Transportation

RINGLING TRAIL COMPLETE STREETS WON PROJECT OF THE YEAR

The Ringling Trail Complete Street was recognized as the Project of the Year by the American Public Works Association (APWA) Florida Chapter during its annual conference in Jacksonville last week. Assistant City Engineer Dan Ohrenstein, project team co-lead along with Capital Projects Manager Camden Mills, accepted the award on behalf of the City of Sarasota.

The Ringling Trail Complete Street project transformed Ringling Boulevard into a complete street in December 2022 with enhanced bicycle safety and expanded multimodal and connectivity opportunities between The Legacy Trail, downtown Sarasota and the Bayfront. The Trail extends one mile between Lime and Pineapple avenues and features protected bike lanes for a safer road experience for recreational cyclists and commuters.

SRQ AIRPORT OPENS NEW CELL PHONE LOT - 124 New Spaces!

The Sarasota Manatee Airport Authority (SMAA) announced the opening of their new and improved Cell Phone Lot at the Sarasota Bradenton International Airport. It is located at 1180 Rental Car Road, Sarasota, Florida, directly across from the previous temporary location, and offers easy access from Old Bradenton Road or the main airport entrance off University Parkway. The new Cell Phone Lot consists of 124 paved parking spaces, 5 of them handicapped accessible, restrooms, and vending machines. The lot is well lit with LED lighting and secured with fencing. Two 8'x16' flight information screens are scheduled to be installed within the next 6 months, providing updated information on flight arrival times. The construction of the roundabout at US 41 at Gulfstream is completed!

The Florida Department of Transportation says that now that the construction project is complete, a separate contract will start this week to begin landscaping in the area.

This will take approximately four months. Lane closures will be during overnight hours, and noise from landscaping vehicles and lighting are to be expected. Keep an eye out if you are driving through the area.

The FDOT team continues to strive to minimize interruptions so lane closures will be limited to overnight hours. Noise and light from landscaping equipment is possible and do be alert for workers in the area.

NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAKES LEADERSHIP OF THE BAY PARK PROJECT

Sarasota's Bay Park Conservancy has a new chief executive – Stephanie Crockatt – who succeeds the volunteer lead for the past four years, AG Lafley.

Crockatt is the executive director of Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy, the nonprofit that manages an 850-acre park system in Buffalo, New York.

As The Bay Park Conservancy's president and chief executive officer, Crockatt will assume overall responsibility for the building of The Bay, a 53-acre park on Sarasota's bayfront, according to a news release. The first phase of the project has already been built, but the second and third phases have not.


