With around 170 participants to the various events coordinated by DSCA created to educate local decision makers and leaders about her Seven Pillars approach to urban planning centered on mental health and wellbeing. Dr. Roe stated that she is very impressed by what she saw in Sarasota, the ever developing Bay Park especially, and by her interactions with community representatives, and she plans to make Sarasota into a case study for her current and future students to learn from.

DSCA April Board Meeting Wrap Up

DSCA Board Meeting | April 6, 2022

Guest Speaker, Brendan Ragan, Artistic Director, Urbanite Theatre

Brendan Ragan explained that the mission of Sarasota's professional "Black Box" theatre, Urbanite, houses playwrights authoring plays that focus on current issues and themes sometimes described as "edgy". Professional directors and actors from across the country spend months in Sarasota working on these plays and presenting them to appreciative audiences looking for alternatives to more "traditional", theater fare (e.g. Asolo, FST). Urbanite features flexible/changeable staging in an intimate setting – only 70 seats for most performances.

The building's location at 1487 Second Street is walkable for lots of downtowners and has plenty of audience parking nearby. The theatre does face a few challenges, the lack of on-site storage space for things like props, scenery, and costumes and housing for directors and actors for the four to ten weeks they are in our downtown area. Urbanite has been renting air BnB's and similar accommodations at affordable costs given the income limit set by having only 70 seats to fill, and some donors have generously served as hosts. Before the pandemic almost all performances were sold out, and as Urbanite is now live again, that degree of success seems to be repeating itself. Mr. Regan's hope for the future is that Urbanite can expand seating but keep its current location, find close storage space, and secure dependable and affordable housing for its visiting artists.

Scooter and Bike Share Program / Bay Runner Trolley Updates





Statistics update on Bay Runner, Scooters

There is good news to report from recently launched Bay Runner program and micromobility system:

- The trolley has already carried over 17,000 passengers making one consider how many cars trips across the bridge are being mitigated because of the trolley!
- All trolleys are now equipped with advance signal remote control this allows trolleys to expedite light signals to green to speed up their headways.
- The scooters/bikes have been used 6,800 trips over 11,700 miles.
