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Sarasota wrestles with definitions of drinking, dining establishments

After gaveling in the Sarasota City Commission's Dec. 5 workshop to discuss staff-proposed zoning text amendments for dining and drinking establishments in the downtown zoning districts, Mayor Liz Alpert suggested first tackling what she thought would be the easiest of the definitions — restaurants

Rather than serving as the appetizer, it turned out to be a full-course meal as commissioners got bogged down in a debate over whether a dining room that brings in prepared food from off-site — or a "ghost kitchen" — is really a restaurant.

Planning Director Steven Cover, City Attorney Robert Fournier and City Manager Marlon Brown attempted to interject that where the food comes from and how the public perceives that is not germane to how a restaurant is licensed relative to alcohol sales, but that did not dampen the debate. Sarasota City Commissioners have initiated discussions on the towing of vehicles from private parking lots in the city. This comes after numerous complaints from people who have had their cars towed from business lots. According to Sarasota Parking General Manager, Broxton Harvey, many of the complaints suggest poor signage or unfair parking restrictions. As such, the commission is exploring ways to address these concerns and ensure that towing activities are carried out in a fair and reasonable manner. DSCA is pleased to report that construction has officially begun on a versatile community park in the ever-growing Rosemary District, located at the intersection of Central and Blvd of the Arts. This exciting development is set to become a vital addition to our neighborhood.

One of this small park's features is its expansive lawn area, thoughtfully designed to accommodate a wide range of activities, including hosting various events and gatherings. Alongside the lawn, carefully selected seating and benches will provide comfort and serve as a central hub for community engagement within our neighborhood. Importantly, residents in the area made it clear to the designers that they wanted shade and trees. The park's design includes a significant number of canopy trees and palms, complemented by the addition of a shade trellis.

Residents are known to be extending appreciation to the Sarasota Department of Parks and Recreation for their contribution on the design of the park, and now its buildout. As construction progresses toward its planned completion in the early part of the new year DSCA will be sharing pictures along the way.


