Jen Ahearn-Koch, Debbie Trice win Sarasota City Commission at-large seats

Incumbent Jen Ahearn-Koch and Rosemary District leader Debbie Trice have been elected to the two at-large seats up for election on the Sarasota City Commission. Community activist Dan Lobeck finished in third place. The results mean that the commission will be majority female again, as three of five commissioners are women. Ahearn-Koch had the highest percentage of the vote in the election – 40.9%. Trice had 31.1% of the vote, and Lobeck 28.1%. Trice said she's excited about the win. A sales tax won renewal in Sarasota County with a massive level of support. Ultimately, almost 78% of voters supported renewing a penny sales tax in the county for an additional 15 years. The City of Sarasota is updating the Engineering Design Criteria Manual (EDCM) to improve the quality of design in the community. The EDCM is actively in the revision process through October 2023. During this time the City will be collecting recommendations for changes to sections of the EDCM.

City staff hosted the first EDCM Public Meeting on November 3rd and presented it at CCNA on November 5th. The first meeting was to inform the public of what the City is doing and present findings of the existing conditions analysis, best practices, and opportunities for the design standards update. At this meeting, a paper survey was provided for public input.

The City would like your input on what infrastructure challenges the community is currently facing that may be solved with updated design criteria.
